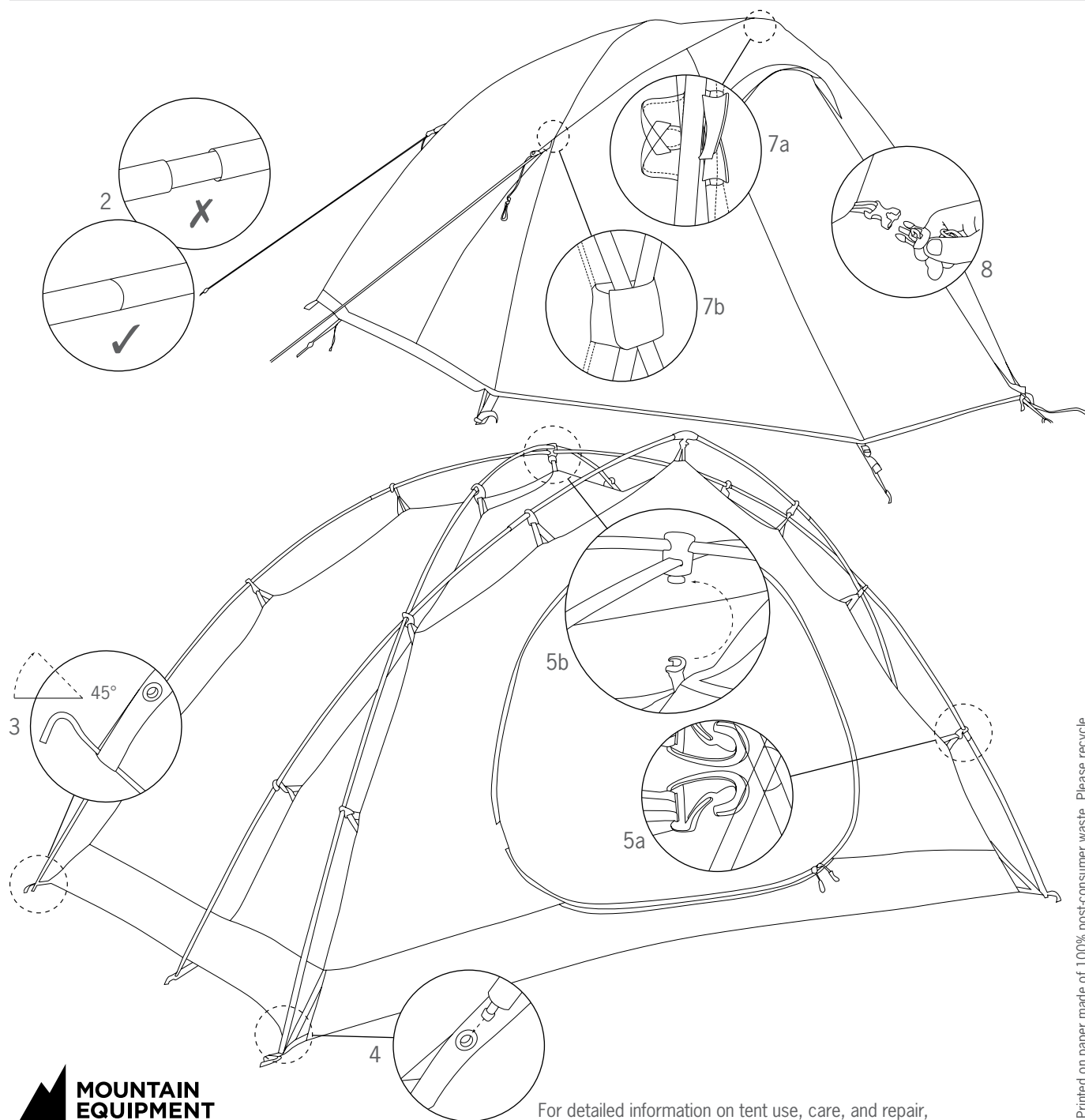




GET TO KNOW YOUR TWIN PEAKS

We recommend you set up your Twin Peaks at home before your first trip. That way, you'll be familiar with the process and the parts involved, making the set-up easier once at your destination.

Your storage bag should include the following:

- Tent body
- Tent fly
- Shockcorded poles (one four-sided hubbed set, and one arched single pole)
- Stakes and guy lines

SET UP

- 1. (Not Pictured)** Pick a well-drained, level spot. Make sure it's clear of debris that could damage the floor. Ensure trees and shrubs won't rub against the tent. Check for standing dead trees or broken tree limbs that might fall on the tent.
- 2.** Assemble the poles. Make sure each ferrule is fully inserted so the pole won't be too long.
- 3.** Spread out the tent body with the floor-side down. Stake out the six cord loops. For the best hold, lean the stakes about 45 degrees away from the tent. Pull the sides tight enough to be straight, but not so tight that it strains the fabric.
- 4.** Insert the ends of the x-shaped hubbed pole assembly into the grommets at the tent corners. Make sure the grooved end of the hub faces down, and the poles with the gold end sections fit into the grommets in the yellow webbing loops.
- 5.** Attach the pole clips (5a) and the roof top clip (5b).
- 6. (Not Pictured)** From the side of the tent with the mesh roof panel, slip the arched pole under the hubbed poles. Insert its ends into the grommets on the tent's non-door sides. Attach the pole clips and the top clip.
- 7.** Drape the fly over the tent body, so the two yellow webbing loops on the fly match up with the two yellow webbing loops on the tent. Attach all the hook-and-loop wrap-ties on the underside of the fly to the appropriate places on the poles (7a). Where two poles cross, attach the extra-long wrap-tie around both poles (7b). Clip all the snap fasteners joining the fly to the tent body together. Adjust tension as needed.
- 8.** Stake out the door and vestibule loops. Stake out the side peg loops, and clip in and stake guy lines, as needed for stability and ventilation.

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
