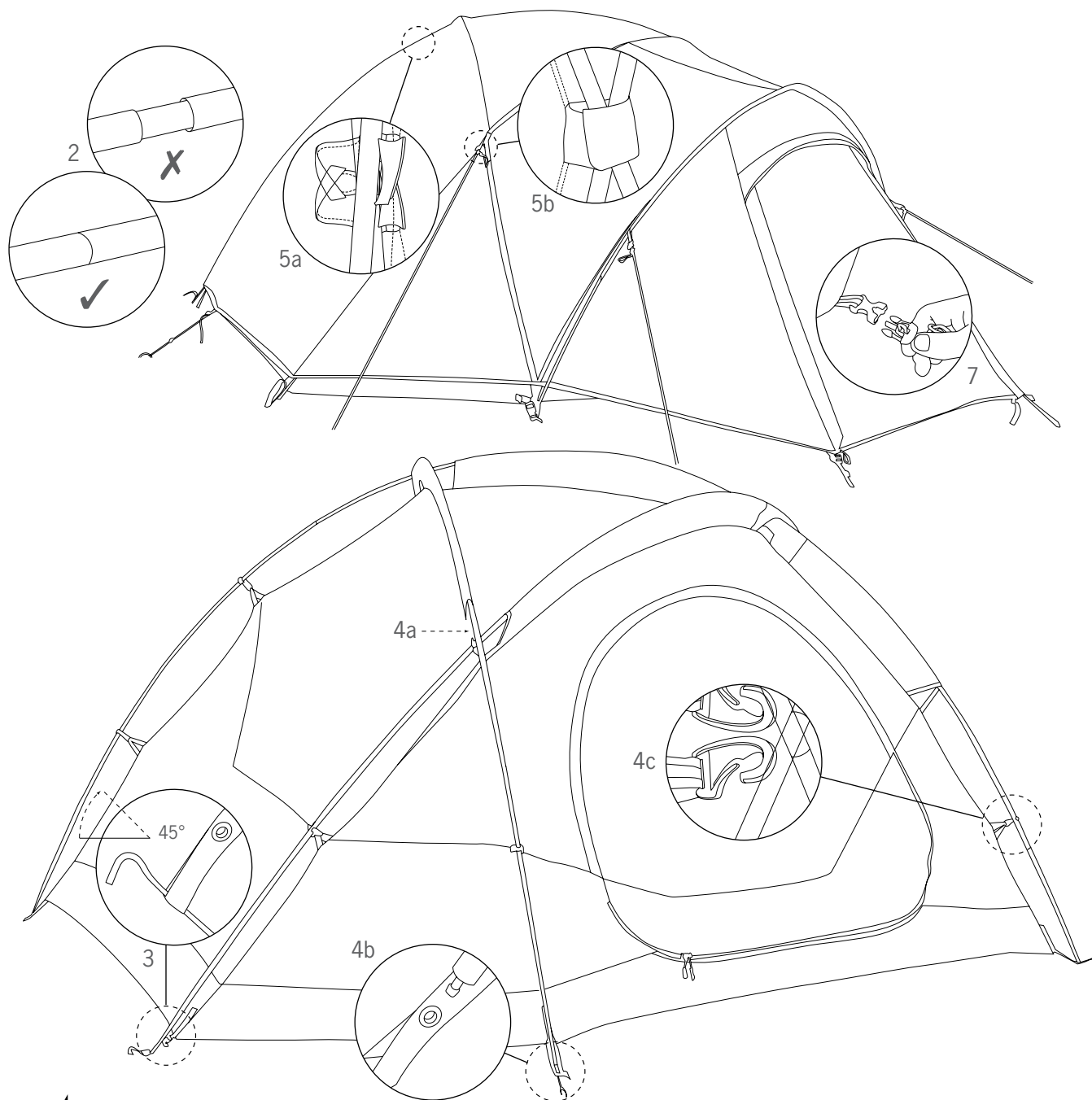




GET TO KNOW YOUR YETI

We recommend you set up your Yeti at home before your first trip. That way, you'll be familiar with the process and the parts involved, making the set-up easier once at your destination.

Your storage bag should include the following:

- Tent body and fly
- Four shock-corded poles (two long straight poles, one short straight pole, and one arched pole)
- Stakes and guy lines

SET UP

- 1. (Not Pictured)** Pick a well-drained, level spot. Make sure it's clear of debris that could damage the floor. Ensure trees and shrubs won't rub against the tent. Check for standing dead trees or broken tree limbs that might fall on the tent.
- 2.** Assemble the poles. Make sure each ferrule is fully inserted so the poles won't be too long.
- 3.** Spread out the tent body with the floor-side down. Stake out the six cord loops. For the best hold, lean the stakes about 45° away from the tent. Pull the sides tight enough to be straight, but not so tight that it strains the fabric.
- 4.** Feed the two longest poles through the pole sleeves leading to the far corners of the tent. Feed the shortest straight pole through the pole sleeve leading from the side of one door to the opposite side of the other door (4a). Starting with the shortest pole, insert all the pole ends into the grommets in the webbing loops (4b). Attach the pole clips (4c).
- 5.** Drape the fly over the tent body so that the yellow webbing loop on the fly lines up with the yellow webbing loop on the tent. Attach all the hook-and-loop wrap-ties on the underside of the fly to the appropriate places on the poles (5a). Where two poles cross, attach the extra-long wrap-tye around both poles (5b).
- 6. (Not Pictured)** Feed the arched pole through the sleeve in the fly. Insert one end of this pole into the additional grommet in the yellow webbing, and the other end into the additional grommet in the grey webbing. Clip all the snap fasteners joining the fly to the tent body together. Adjust tension as needed.
- 7.** Stake out the door and vestibule loops. Stake out the fly peg loops, and clip in and stake guy lines as needed, for stability and ventilation. Open or close the vents in the end wall and over the small door as needed for venting or weather protection.

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
